**Sub: Prior Informed Consent (PIC) for import of 12,075 kg (350 flasks) mercury from Thailand to India by M/s Purple Products Pvt Ltd.**

Greetings from India!

The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEF&CC), Govt. of India is in receipt of a letter from Pollution Control Department, Thailand dated 28.03.20223 forwarding the Form A for seeking consent for export of total 40,020 kg (1160 flasks) mercury from Thailand to India.

2. Further, the MoEF&CC has received applications from M/s Purple Products Pvt. Ltd. for seeking PIC for import of total 12,075 kg (350 flasks) from Thailand.
3. The application of the importer (M/s Purple Products Pvt. Ltd.) has been examined. Accordingly, the consent for import of mercury for the total quantity of 12,075 kg (350 flasks) is hereby furnished in Form-A (as enclosed) for use in manufacture of mercury salts which is allowable purpose under Minamata Convention.
4. With this, the total quantity of PIC issued for mercury import is 18,975 kg (550 flasks) against the quantity of 40,020 kg (1160 flasks) provided in the Form-A by NFP, Thailand.

#### Guidance

Information regarding the approximate total quantity of mercury to be shipped allows the importing country to make an informed decision about any shipment to which it is consenting, while the approximate date of shipping assists in any effort to track the shipment that the country may wish to undertake.

If the mercury is sourced from primary mercury mining it may not be used for artisanal and small-scale gold mining but it may be used, for a limited time as set out in paragraph 4 of article 3, for the manufacturing of mercury-added products in accordance with article 4 or in manufacturing processes in accordance with article 5. It may also be disposed of in accordance with article 11 using operations that do not lead to recovery, recycling, reclamation, direct reuse or alternative uses.

If the mercury has been determined by the exporting Party to be excess mercury from the decommissioning of chlor-alkali facilities the Party is to take measures to ensure that it is disposed of in accordance with the guidelines for environmentally sound management referred to in paragraph 3 (a) of article 11, using operations that do not lead to recovery, recycling, reclamation, direct reuse or alternative uses.

If the mercury is to be disposed of, the procedures for transboundary movements of waste set out in article 11 (3) (c) of the Convention shall be followed. In such cases this form cannot be used. When the exporting country is a non-Party, the importing Party shall not allow shipment where the mercury originates from one of these two sources, unless it has applied paragraph 9 of article 3.
