

Decisions of Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change with respect to import and export of hazardous waste under the Hazardous Waste (Management, Handling & Trans-boundary Movement) Rules, 2008 as approved by the Competent Authority on the basis of Decision of the 62nd meeting of Expert Committee held on 30th September -1st October 2015 for appraisal of such applications.

AGENDA ITEM 2.1: IMPORT OF ELECTRICAL AND ELECTRONIC ASSEMBLIES ETC

2.1.1 M/s Nokia Solutions & Networks India Pvt. Ltd., Bangalore (F. No. 23-69/2011-HSMD(vol.-II):

2.1.2 M/s HCL Services Ltd., Noida(F. No. 23-49/2015-HSMD):

2.1.16.M/s Wipro GE Healthcare Pvt. Ltd., Bangalore(F. No. 5-26/2014-HSMD):

Decision: The applicant should produce the spare replacement policy to the effect that these would be used spares. Secondly, the destinations of re-export of the defective spares/parts are those nations having a policy not to allow import of such electrical/electronic items. A letter to the effect that such import will be permissible should also be submitted.

2.1.24.M/s NEC Technologies India Pvt. Ltd., Bangalore(F. No. 23-38/2014-HSMD):

Decision: A certificate or letter should be submitted by the applicant that the national authority of the country where re-export is proposed will accept such goods.

2.1.4 M/s Semi-Conductor Laboratory, Deptt. of Space, Mohali, Punjab(F. No. 23-174/2015-HSMD):

Decision: The Committee noted that SKU 11002411590 PC BOARD S/N PC-121-0588 were sent for repair to U.K. and are being imported after repair. The Ministry therefore recommended the import.

2.1.5 M/s Tata Consultancy Services Ltd., Mumbai (F. No. 23-8/2012-HSMD):

Decision: This Ministry has granted NOC on import of 101 no. of second hand cash registers with printers, monitor, keyboard, scanner etc. from Canada for testing and development of software for export purposes. This NOC was valid for a period of one year from the date of import. Since, the tenure for the project of testing and development of software has been extended for a period of one year more, the Ministry recommended that the period of validity of earlier permission may be extended by one more year with the same terms and conditions.

2.1.7.M/s Johnson Matthey India Pvt. Ltd., Gurgaon (F. No. 23-47/2012-HSMD):

Decision: From the documents it is noted that the year of manufacture of the item is 1990. The Committee suggested calling the technical representative of the company to explain the reason for importing such old equipment.

2.1.8.M/s Sigtech Wireless Technologies Pvt. Ltd., Thiruvandrum, Kerala (F. No. 23-148/2015-HSMD):

Decision: From the documents submitted by the applicant the Committee noted that the item has already been imported, moreover the application is not even signed. The person who represented the company could not explain the circumstances under which the item has been imported without the prior permission of this Ministry. The Ministry therefore recommended that a complete application should be submitted to the Ministry and a technical representative should come for presentation in the next meeting.

2.1.10 M/s KONE Elevator India Pvt. Ltd., Chennai (F. No. 23-139/2015-HSMD):

Decision: After going through the documents the Committee could not make out the details of items proposed to be imported. Since, the items are meant for use in lifts which have safety implications, the Committee suggested calling the technical representative for explaining the nature of items proposed to be imported and the reasons for importing old items.

2.1.13 M/s Anand Brothers, Karampura, New Delhi (F. No. 23-172/2015-HSMD):

Decision: As the applicant did not come for presentation, the committee did not consider his case. Since, the matter has been pending for a long time and the applicant doesn't seem to be interested, the Ministry recommended delisting the case.

2.1.14.M/s Flextronics Technologies(I) Pvt. Ltd., Bangalore(F. No. 23-94/2015-HSMD):

Decision: The applicant has provided the documents to show that 7000 tonnes of defective networking equipment/ computer part and accessories have been exported for repair. The applicant should submit the same in numbers as it is not feasible to verify in weight. An export document verifying the unique machines/equipment to establish that only those no. of equipment exported are being imported should also be submitted.

2.1.17.M/s Lotus Labs Pvt. Ltd., Bangalore(F. No. 23-157/2015-HSMD):

Decision: The Committee noted that the items have already been imported. The Committee was informed that these items are meant for carrying out analytical services and have been imported from the principals in the USA. The applicant pleaded that they were not aware of the procedure of obtaining the prior permission from the Ministry. The items are of 2006 (1) and 2011 (3) make and are having CEC from USA. The applicant has given undertaking that if any of the instruments become non- functional within 5 years it will be re-exported. The Ministry recommended the import.

2.1.25.M/s Groz-BeckertAsia(P) Ltd., Chandigarh(F. No. 23-25/2012-HSMD(Vol.-II)):

Decision: The Committee noted that the applicant has now submitted the clarifications from their principals in Germany who have stated that they themselves are the manufacturers of the machines and these machines are only used for captive use and not for sale. They have also confirmed that the three items have been refurbished in 2015 and all the worn out parts have been replaced with new ones enhancing the life by about 10 years. For the fourth item namely the measuring instrument, a certificate from an independent CE has been attached indicating five years residual life. In view of the above, the Ministry recommended the import of all the four items.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 2.2.: IMPORT OF BATTERY/LEAD SCRAP/TITANIUM SCRAP ETC.:

2.2.1.M/s Eswari Global Metal Industries Pvt. Ltd., Unit-II, Mangalore(F. No. 23-31/2009-HSMD)(Vol.-II):

Decision: The Committee noted that the applicant was granted NOC for the import of lead scrap earlier as well. It is also observed that as per the consents and registration, the capacity of the applicants' unit has gone up from 5000 MT to 12000 MT per year of lead ingots. The Ministry therefore recommended import of 4500 MT of lead scrap Scrap as per ISRI Code Radio, Racks, Rails, Ropes, Relay, Rakes, Rents.

2.2.2 M/s Ayisha Saw Mills, Tamilnadu (F. No. 5-23/2015-HSMD):

Decision: The Committee noted that the applicant has requisite pollution control facilities and valid consents /

authorization/registration from Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board. The Committee therefore recommended the import of 200 MT of Lead scrap (RACKS, RELAY, RADIO, RENTS etc.) but not RAINS.

AGENDA NO.2.3: IMPORT OF PET BOTTLE SCRAP/PLASTIC SCRAP/LDPE/POLYURETHANE FOAM SCRAP:

2.3.1 M/s PMS Exports Pvt. Ltd., Valsad, Gujarat(F.No. 17-16/2009-HSMD):

Decision: The Committee noted that the applicant has been given permission earlier for import of 1500 MT of virgin plastic scrap (HDPE/LDPE/LLDPE/PP/ Polystyrene) for conversion to plastic granules. The Ministry recommended import of 1500 MT of virgin plastic scrap as above.

2.3.2.M/s Shree Bhavani Engineering Works, Navi Mumbai (F. No. 5-10/2015-HSMD):

Decision: As per the complete information provided by the applicant, the Committee recommended import of 400 MT of virgin plastic waste (LLDP/LDPE/HDPE/PP/Polystyrene) based on the capacity of 100 tonnes /month given in CTO.

2.3.3. M/s R.K. Plastics, Falna, Rajasthan (F. No. 17-19/2009-HSMD):

Decision: The Committee observed that the applicant has earlier been granted permission for import of 500 MT of virgin, cellulose/ plastic waste and scrap. The Ministry recommended import of 500 MT of virgin plastic scrap.

2.3.4. M/s Jain Tubes Corporation, Falna, Rajasthan (F. No. 17-18/2009)-HSMD:

Decision: The applicant was granted NOC for import of 330 MT of virgin cellulosic and polyethene waste / scrap in 2014. The Ministry now recommended import of 330 MT of virgin cellulosic and polyethene waste / scrap.

2.3.5. M/s Ganesha Ecosphere Ltd., Kanpur, U.P.(F. No. 17-9/2010-HSMD):

Decision: The justification along with technical capability of the project applicant for the huge quantity should be submitted.

2.3.6. M/s Globe Products, Jamnagar (F. No. 17-7/2010-HSMD(Vol.-II):

Decision: The applicant was granted permission to import 500 MT of acrylic plastic scrap in 2014. The Ministry recommended 500 MT of

acrylic plastic scrap for manufacturing acrylic plastic sheets, bangles, tubes and MMA monomer.

2.3.7. M/s Chirag Enterprises, Jamnagar (F. No. 17-29/2009-HSMD):

Decision: The applicant was granted permission to import 1000 MT of acrylic plastic scrap in 2014. The Ministry recommended 1000 MT of plastic scrap for manufacturing MMA monomer.

2.3.8.M/s Rushabh Industries, Jamnagar (F. No. 23-137/2015-HSMD):

Decision: The applicant has applied for import of 300 MT of acrylic plastic sheet scrap produced poly methyl methacrylate monomer, the consent from Gujarat Pollution Control Board is only for 32 MT /month. The Ministry therefore recommended import of only 120 MT of acrylic plastic sheet scrap.

2.3.9.M/s Rajdeep Plastics, Jamnagar(F. No. 17-7/2013-HSMD) :

Decision: The Committee observed that the applicant was granted the permission to import of acrylic plastic sheet scrap in the year 2014. The Ministry recommended 500 MT of above stated scrap.

2.3.10.M/s Laxmi Remote India Pvt. Ltd., Noida, U.P.(F.No.5-37/2014-HSMD):

Decision: Based on the video shown and presentation made by the applicant, the Committee recommended import of 1000 MT of virgin plastic waste (ABS/HIPS/Poly Carbonate) in the first instance. The import of balance quantity would be considered subsequent to the site visit by the Committee members present in New Delhi and after confirming the capacity of the plant.

2.3.11.M/s PYE Tools Pvt. Ltd., Ludhiana(F. No. 17-7/2015-HSMD):

Decision: Based on the presentation and the video shown by the applicant, the Ministry recommended import of 265 MT of used CDs and DVDs for producing plastic granules.

2.3.12 M/s Eastern Cargo Carriers (India) Pvt. Ltd., Mumbai(F.No.23-66/2018-HSMD):

Decision: The Committee noted that the applicant wants to import waste of plastic and aluminium foil composite packaging material. The Committee also noted that such composites could as well be with paper, plastic and Al foil all together. The applicant clarified that they will import only the shredded packaging material containing only plastic (PP) and aluminium foil devoid of any paper/cellulosic

material. The Ministry recommended the import of 2400 MT of shredded plastic and aluminium foil subject to the following conditions:

- a. The entire consignment has to be clean having no contaminants.
- b. There should be no other constituents other than shredded plastic and aluminium foil.

2.3.13M/s Jayachandran Plastics Pvt Ltd, Coimbatore(F.No. 17-5/2015):

Decision: Based on the video shown and presentation made by the applicant before the applicant, the Ministry recommended import of 1500 MT of PET bottle scrap in the first instance. The import of balance quantity would be considered subsequent to the site visit by CPCB and after confirming the capacity of the plant.

AGENDA NO.2.4: IMPORT OF RUBBER SCRAP ETC.

2.4.1M/s MSS Rubber and Reclaims Pvt. Ltd., Kochin, Kerala (F. No. 5-1/2014-HSMD) :

Decision: The Ministry recommended import of 1000 MT of used multi-cut nylon tyre, rubber scrap and buffing rubber powder.

2.4.2 M/s Telangana Rubber Industry, Telangana (F. No. 23-140/2015-HSMD):

Decision: The Ministry recommended a site visit by Central Pollution Control Board before considering the application.

2.4.3.M/s Om Shree Rubber, RamnagaraDistt., Karnataka (F. No. 23-155/2015-HSMD):

Decision: From the video presentation, the Committee observed that all the handling operations are manual, the housekeeping is poor and there are no safety guards provided on moving machinery and no fibre emission control. The Committee has advised the applicant to make necessary improvements, after which a site visit will be conducted by CPCB. The case will be re-considered after the submission of the site-visit report.

2.4.4.M/s Mounika Industry, Mahabubnagar, Telangana(F. No. 23-273/2014-HSMD):

Decision: The Ministry recommended import of 2000 tonnes of scrap nylon tyres for making crumb rubber.

2.4.5M/s Mumbai Fabrics Pvt. Ltd., Mumbai(F.No. 23-73/2013-HSMD):

Decision: The Committee noted that during the financial year 2015-2016, no permission has been given to the applicant for import of waste tyres till date. In the earlier meeting the Committee had recommended that 1/3 of the capacity (and upto 50% in case of good environmental performance report) would be allowed in a period of 12 months. Since, some difficulties have been encountered in adopting this procedure, the Committee recommended that the period of 12 months should be taken as the financial year in consonance with the period of annual returns that are filed as per HW Rules, 2008. In view of this, the Ministry recommended import of 20,000 MT of waste tyres.

2.4.6M/s Dashmesh Rubber Industries Pvt. Ltd., Valsad (F. No. 23-39/2015-HSMD):

Decision: Earlier the applicant has been granted permission for the import of 400 MT of scrap tyres for making reclaimed rubber. The Ministry again recommended import of 600 MT of scrap tyres.

2.4.7M/s Nutec Oil and Energy Pvt. Ltd., Chennai(F. No. 23-306/2012-HSMD):

Decision: From the inspection report of the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board submitted by the applicant it can be seen that the following three points have not been complied with regard to the SOP:

- i. Installation of the flaring system;
- ii. No. of sensors along with alarm should be installed at all the vulnerable points such as all sealing points and gas/liquid storage;
- iii. List of potential users of carbon black and tyre pyrolysis oil.

In addition the applicant should also provide details of converting the waste tyre into crumb rubber for feeding to the reactor. The Committee will re-consider the case after receiving confirmation on the above points.

2.4.8M/s SohanlalShantilal Jain, Mumbai(F.No. 23-116/2015-HSMD):

Decision: Based on the presentation and the video shown by the applicant before the Committee, the Ministry recommended import of 3000 MT of scrap rubber tyres, tubes and conveyor belts for making various rubber products and granules. The balance quantity would be considered after site visit by CPCB.

2.4.9.M/s Tinna Rubber and Infrastructure Ltd., New Delhi:

Decision: The applicant has multiple units at different locations and has been importing waste rubber tyres. This is a new unit in Himachal Pradesh for which the applicant is proposing to import 5000 MT of waste rubber tyre for making crumb rubber. The Ministry recommended the import of 2500 MT of waste rubber tyre in the first instance. Since this is a new unit the Committee recommended the site visit by Shri G.S. Dang, Expert Member of the Committee. The balance quantity will be recommended after the site visit.

2.4.10 M/s Indian International, Bulandshahr, U.P. :The application pertains to import of used rubber tyres (F.No.23-97/2015-HSMD):

Decision: The Committee agreed to site inspection of the unit by the chairman and Expert Committee Member.

2.4.11 M/s S.S, Endothermics, Mumbai (F.No. 23-56/2015-HSMD) :

Decision: The Committee considered the inspection report of CPCB and observed that the applicant is making tyre chips of 25 mm and. Amended CTO from Maharashtra Pollution Control Board for chips has also been provided along with the inspection report. The Committee therefore recommended the import of 17,000 Mt of tyre scrap on the basis of capacity of 49,000 MT.

2.4.12 M/s Kohinoor Reclamation, Kathua, J&K (F.No. 23-251/2012-HSMD):

Decision: Based on the inspection report of CPCB and subsequent improvement made by the applicant as per the photographs submitted vide e-mail, the Ministry recommended the import of 5000 MT of tyre scrap.

2.4.13 M/s Horizon Reclaim India Pvt. Ltd., Haridwar (F. No. No.23-112/2013-HSMD):

Decision: Based on the inspection report of the Expert Member of the Committee and the improvement made by the applicant as per the suggestion of the Expert Members, the Ministry recommended import of 10,000 MT of tyre scrap.

AGENDA NO.2.5: IMPORT OF USED OIL.

2.5.1 M/s G.S. Bharat Refinery, Bahadurgarh (F. No. 23-2/2010-HSMD):

Decision :The Ministry recommended import of 1000 MT of used oil (waste mineral oil unfit for their originally intended use) but not fuel oil.

2.5.2 M/s Plus Lubricants, Mumbai (F. No. 23-109/2015-HSMD):

Decision: The Committee noted that the applicant has still not submitted the analysis report as per Schedule V Part A of HW Rules, 2008, hence the matter is deferred. The applicant is again requested to submit the analysis report as per the characteristics given in Schedule V A of the Rules.

2.5.3.M/s Lubrina Recycling (P) Ltd., West Bengal (F. No. 23-80/2015-HSMD):

Decision: The Ministry recommended addition of one more supplier in the list of suppliers of used oil.

AGENDA NO.2.6: IMPORT OF NON HAZARDOUS POLYSILOXANE WASTE

2.6.1.M/s Silicon International Products, Raigad, Maharashtra (F. No. 23-47/2009-HSMD):

Decision: The Committee noted that the company has been importing waste polysiloxane with permission from this Ministry. The Ministry therefore recommended the import of 3000 MT of polysiloxane waste for making various grades of silicon fluid.

AGENDA NO 2.7 : IMPORT OFALUMINIUM DROSS THRILL

2.7.1 .M/s Ratan Aluminium Recycling Pvt. Ltd., Faridabad (F. No. 5-22/2015HSMD):

Decision: The Committee noted that the item is included in Schedule III D of the notification on HW Rules, 2008 and does not require permission from the Ministry. The applicant has already submitted the compliance of the other requirements.

3.1.1M/s Ultrust Solutions(I) Pvt. Ltd., Tamilnadu (F. No. 23-12/2011-HSMD): The application pertains to Export of E-waste:

Decision: The Committee recommended the addition of name of importer in Japan namely JX Metal trading Comnpny Ltd. However the validity of the earlier permission may be extended subject to the applicant obtaining insurance policy covering the export in the financial year 2015-16.
