Services

○ **Abstracting Services**

- ◆ The service is provided and will be continued. The information selection and storage are ideally suited to meet demands of user group.

○ **NEWS Retrieval Services**

- ◆ The Centre collects latest reviews, articles, related to the initiatives taken by government, ministers' etc. through the newspapers, internet, magazines etc. The information collected can be accessed from the centre by filling up the query form and specifying the requirement.

○ **Query Answer Services**

- ◆ The ENVIS centre responds to various requests for information from several user groups on the subject of "Panchayati Raj and Environment". The centre also responds to a number of queries from users of outside countries through its query form. During the year, on an average 250-300 queries are answered. Major subjects in the queries are environmental awareness, pollution and waste, environment and development.
