The expenditure is to be incurred as per the allocation of funds. There shall be no xi. diversion of earmarked funds from one item to another one except in case of unavoidable circumstances and only with the prior approval of MoEF&CC. If the implementing agency does not use the fund for the purpose for which it was given, it has to be refunded along with interest.

There should not be any overlapping of activities under the scheme with the XII.

activities of other ongoing schemes of Central / State Govt.

The programme is to be monitored by State regularly and the quarterly progress xiii. report shall be submitted by the State on the progress of implementation of the scheme in format given in Annexure - VII of the Operational Guidelines of the Scheme, for every quarter of the year.

The infrastructure created will be fully utilized for the purpose for which they have XIV. been sanctioned and all recurring cost in respect of all items sanctioned will be borne

by the State Government.

For the proposed infrastructure works including construction of water tanks, location XV. of the site along with the details of GPS details may be submitted to this office.

The fixed assets created out of this grant shall not be disposed off without xvi. concurrence of this Ministry.
