I am writing this letter indicating the highlights of the achievements and activities of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEF&CC) during the month of August, 2021:

- 2. In line with the clarion call given by Hon'ble Prime Minister to phase out single use plastic by 2022, the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India, has notified the Plastic Waste Management Amendment Rules, 2021, prohibiting identified single use plastic items, which have low utility and high littering potential. The notification inter-alia include:
 - i) Prohibition of the manufacture, import, stocking, distribution, sale and use of single-use plastic, including polystyrene and expanded polystyrene, commodities with effect from the 1st July, 2022.
 - ii) Increasing the thickness of plastic carry bags from existing fifty microns to:
 - a) Seventy-five microns with effect from 30th September, 2021,
 - b) One hundred and twenty microns with effect from the 31st December, 2022.
 - Guidelines for Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) have been given legal force through present amendment rules, for effective implementation.
- 3. Two Guidelines (policy decisions) were issued under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 during the month of August, 2021which is as follows.
 - i) Guidelines dated 23/08/2021: "Considering linear projects linked to mining projects as standalone projects
 - ii) Guidelines dated 16/08/2021: "Diversion of forest land for non-forest purposes under Forest(Conservation) Act, 1980 Revised guidelines for Tusser Cultivation (Vanya Silk Cultivation)
- 4. Scientists of BSI reported six taxa of plants as new additions to India viz. Gastrochilus yei (orchidaceae), Eriochloa meyeriana (Poaceae), Cloniophora plumsoa (Cloniophoracea) and three wild mushrooms i.e. Lactarius ambigus, L. hirtipes and L kesiyae from Arunachal Pradesh. Besides, they also reported five taxa as new additions to the state of Telangana and West Bengal. i.e. Urochloa trichopus, Schizachyrium brevifolium, Iphegnia magnifica from Telangana and Ischaemum ciliare (proceae), a new record for the flora of Telangana State and Leucophanes as a new generic record to West Bengal. Besides, BSI released its e-archival data base of

- 5. Two species (One Genus Andreimyrme Lelej, 1995 (Hymenoptera: Multilidae and one species of Fish, Pseudamia gelatinosa Smith, 1956 were reported for the first time in India.
- 6. MoEFCC celebrated "World Elephant Day 2021" on 12th August, 2021. The proceedings were made available on YouTube also for the people who could not join Webex. Sh. Bhupender Yadav, Hon'ble Minister, MoEFCC and Sh. Ashwini Kumar Choubey, MoS, MoEFCC were the Chief Guest and Guest of Honour on this occasion. The meeting was addressed by Sh. R. P. Gupta, Secretary, MoEFCC and other high officials.
- 7. 75 years of Independence was celebrated as Azadi ka Amrut Mahotsav on 15th August and a video created by RMNH, Bhubaneswar and NMNH, New Delhi entitled "SANKALP" was released by Headquarters in its YouTube channel on this occasion. In this regard many other events have been planned and are being executed to celebrate 75 years of independence.
- 8. Hon'ble MEFCC held a meeting with U.K. Delegation led by Rt. Hon'ble Alok Sharma, CoP 26 President Designate, UK to India on 18th August, 2021.
- 9. India-U.S. Bilateral: Telephonic Discussion held between Hon'ble MEFCC and U.S. Special Presidential Envoy for Climate (SPEC) Mr. John Kerry on 24th August, 2021.
- 10. BRICS Virtual Meeting of Environment Ministers held on 27 August, 2021 under Indian Presidency, and it was preceded by BRICS Senior Officers JWG Meeting on 26 August, 2021
- 11. Environmental Clearances: Number of projects appraised: During the Expert Appraisal Committee meetings held in August 2021, a total of 121 projects pertaining to different sectors were appraised. Number of projects cleared: During the month, 65 projects were accorded environmental clearance and 34 projects were prescribed ToRs. Thus, a total of 99 proposals were cleared during the month. The status of environmental clearance and TOR of Projects for the month is at Annexure-I. (*Number of projects appraised and number of projects cleared during the month are not correlated as the appraisal and grant of clearance of a project may not necessarily occur during the same month.)
- 12. Forest Clearances: During the month, 1835.75 ha of forestland in 133 cases were approved under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for use for nonforest purposes. 1348.13 ha of non-forest land and 2391.46 ha of degraded forestland were earmarked for Compensatory Afforestation (C.A.).

- 13. **Total Expenditure**: An expenditure of **Rs 481.93 Crores (Provisional)** has been incurred until **31**st **August 2021** against the Net budget estimate of **Rs 3136.58 crores** for FY 2021-22.
- 14. Eco sensitive Zone: Out of 662 Protected Areas (PAs) in the country, the Ministry has issued ESZ Notifications for 574 PAs, including Draft Notifications for 131 PAs and Final Notifications for 443 PAs. Further, ESZ notifications for 7 PAs have been approved and are under process for publications.
- 15. **Public Grievances**: During the month **288** Public Grievances were redressed and **171** Grievances were pending.
