The current National Forest Policy was formulated in 1988 based on the principles of maintaining environmental stability and ecological balance, participatory forest management and to increase the forest and tree cover with people's involvement. The Policy has already completed 25 years and it is proposed to revisit the Policy in view of later developments in the natural resource management and emerging national and international issues and challenges in the forestry sector. The review of the Policy aims at critical analysis of the Policy based on various parameters, identifying the gaps in the implementation of the policy and suggesting ways and means to strengthen the forest policy framework to meet the emerging needs. Accordingly, a Core Group is constituted for review of NFP and to prepare new draft of NFP as under:

- ii. to suggest the various thematic areas that need to be added to the Policy in view of the subsequent developments that have taken place both at national (PESA, FRA, Biological Diversity Act,2002 etc.) as well as international levels including Post Rio UN Conference on Environment & Development (1992)which broadly includes Agenda 21, Forest Principles and UN Conventions on Climate change, Biodiversity and Descritification, Rio+20 (UN Conference on Sustainable Development) and International Arrangement on Forests etc. to strengthen the implementation of the Policy.

- iii. to project a futuristic scenario in view of current changes in demographic and socio economic conditions and accordingly integrate proposed suggestions in NFP.
- iv. to prepare a Zero Draft of a new Proposed NFP.
- v. The committee is to complete the review and submit the Zero draft within one year.
- 3. The Chairman of the Committee may invite expert (s) as and when required carry out its functions effectively.
- 4. TA/DA for the non-official Members will be borne by the Ministry of Environment and Forests as per the Govt. of India rules.
